## What is an association and why is it important?

#### Characteristics:

- Voluntary participation.
- Equal rights for all members.
- Common objective(s). There is always an idea or project behind an association
- Existence of statutes as legal basis, defining the modus vivendi.
- Simple organisation usually based on a committee and the members.

There are more than 100'000 associations in Switzerland for a total of 8,42 million inhabitants.

#### Pros and contras of associations

Pros			
Commitment			
Common values			
Democratic decisions			
They occupy spaces that are not taken in account by the authorities			
Non-profit (escapes economy)			
Simple organisational form allows quick action			
Have possibilities to ensure financing private entities or institutions do not have			
Instrument of socialisation			
Networking between like-minded people			
Management learning			

Contras
No secured financing other than membership fees
Myth that being amateurs equals incapacity/lack of knowledge
Difficult collaboration between professionals and non- professional volunteers
No official control of finances (for the non-inscribed smaller associations)
Continuity is difficult to ensure (generation change)
Democratic decisions may also have negative consequences

## A quick history of associative life in Switzerland in archaeology

1742: Deutsche Gesellschaft zur Förderung der Deutsche Sprache in Basel: first society to support local historical research in Switzerland (Augusta Raurica)

19th century – 30'000 societies exist in Switzerland. From 1820 onwards a plethora of associations and societies take charge of the «preservation» and «research» of archaeological sites

1907: drafting of the Swiss Civil Code and redefinition of the role of associations defending historical sciences and archaeology





#### **Conclusions**

- Associations are getting older, and have problems renewing members.
- The assocations are now at a turning point because of a stronger individualism of the population and the development of new communication methods.
- Associations have to adapt to these new criteria. The ways of working have to change.
- Networking may be one part of the solution.
